# Greenlink Trail Old King's Road Reserve

In 1911, the Dominion Steel Company was formed by a merger and began to make money and expand. This led to the immigration of people from all over the world and it also meant jobs for local people such as the Mi'kmaq who were living in various regions of Cape Breton.

The King's Road Indian Reserve had grown beyond its limits by 1899 and the result was overcrowding of the Reserve. With its key location in a developing city, this situation put the Mi'kmaq in conflict with their neighbours who were not accustomed to the Native way of life. So began the King's Road Indian Reserve Court Case to remove the Mi'kmaq from the land. In 1914, at the time of the King's Road Court Case, there were 27 homes and 27 individual families living on the Reserve.

## Mi'kmaw Petroglyphs

The Mi'kmaq created enduring art. Some of this art has been carved into the rock of the province. These rock pictures, or petroglyphs, record their lives and the things they saw around them.

## King's Road



This Hieroglyphic stands for L'nu which originally meant human being or man but now is translated as Aboriginal or First Nation. We are the original people of this land, placed here by Creator to be the caretakers and protectors of our birthplace, Mi'kma'ki.

## TRAIL ETIQUETTE

Ensure your own safety and expect safe practice from other trail users

Exercise caution at all times

**Cyclists must yield to all other users**

Always clean up—do not litter

**Do not make fires**

Respect wildlife—your surroundings are home to many plants and animals

**Trail Riders (Cyclists)**  
Stay to the right of the trail  
(except when passing)

 Give a clear warning signal when passing – call out “Passing on your left”

*Yield to other trail users when entering and crossing a trail*

**Walkers**  
Walk on right when possible, move further right to enable others to pass in safety



No motorized bikes or all terrain vehicles  
Violators will be prosecuted



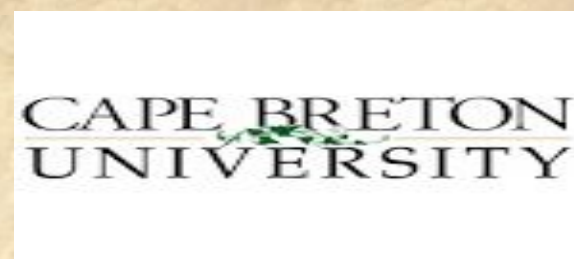
